From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Advent greetings to you all in the name of the coming Messiah, Jesus Christ.

The Gospel reading for the 2nd Sunday of Advent (December 10) is Mark 1:1–8, which begins: "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

Right away, Mark tells us all about this Gospel he is sharing with us. It's the story of Jesus, God's anointed (that what "Christ means), the very Son of God. From now until November 2024, we will be hearing readings from Mark (with plenty of John's gospel mixed in, too!) that will remind us again of the identity and purpose of Jesus and His universe-altering ministry.

This is exactly the one we need to come among us. Not a mere teacher. Not a mere prophet. Not merely a kind person with great ideas on how to better love and serve our neighbors. God's anointed. God's one and only Son.

The darkness of this time of year is a perfect metaphor for the darkness of our lives and our world. Chaos. War. Division. Struggle. Illness. Death. I look around and see all kinds of problems that make me feel sad, anxious, worried, and unsettled ... and vulnerable. And as a pastor, I spend a lot of time in prayerful conversation with others who feel the same way.

But Christ Jesus – Son of God – comes to us to save us from this present sin and darkness. And so, we adorn our sanctuary with something more than trees and nativity scenes during this season of Advent. We adorn it with blue, the color of hope, and tell ourselves again and again that Christ – not merely Christmas – is coming soon. Coming to save us from ourselves, from our troubles, from our death. And take us to be with Him and the Father forever. To a place with no more tears, no more suffering, no more death. I can hardly wait.

And so, we mark time in this season with candles, music, and readings about hope from scripture. But we will engage in other hopeful rituals, too. The giving tree, the Children's Christmas program, Choir Sunday, the seasonal decorating and more. I love these traditions of music, giving, and adornment, because they are hallmarks of a season in which we hope together and celebrate Christmas' and Christ's impending arrival. May your own preparations for Christ and Christmas be full of blessedness and joy.

If we do this next year it is recommended we start serving at the same time as trick or treating. Work continues on the Congregational Christmas event on December 3rd. We will be having a potluck after church followed by craft activities. Looking forward to planning other congregational activities this winter. Contacting Sam Sundby to get an estimate on different hot water heater options for the kitchen. Also working on organizing the kitchen pantry. Thank you to the members of this committee for faithfully helping out to provide meals on Wednesday nights, at special events, as well as organizing Sunday morning coffee.

Outreach Evangelism: Rick Johnson—Met September 26 and October 24, 2023

The Outreach Committee continues to work towards a better and welcoming church. We wish to make our church a place welcoming for all who wish to attend and take part in our worship and fellowship. We welcome new ideas and suggestions to make our goal easier. Any ideas are always welcome. One program we have going on right now is our connection with our friends in Indonesia. We have had communications with them via Zoom, so we can speak face to face. Our first meeting was a "get to know each other" as they had 7 members wishing to talk to us about their country and area. When we talked about the church, we found out that they were going to meet in a home for the first service. Since that meeting, their numbers have gone up with the hope to have 150 at their service. They have moved into a larger building with seating of 150–200. All equipment is borrowed from another church, including tables and chairs. They are expecting to soon have a building with seating for 1500–2000 people, so we can see that they have big plans for the future! 


Finance Committee: Bryan Greenwaldt— Met on October 10, 2023


