## From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Nearly-November blessings to you, dear Saints of God.

This month's installment of Mark is the most profound, life-changing story from the gospel, so far. It is the story of the Passion and Death of Jesus, recorded in Mark 14:1-15:47. Above all, I encourage you to read or listen to this story in its entirety. Experience the incredible lengths to which God was willing to go to share His love with you. Immerse yourself in the details of Jesus betrayal, arrest, trial, execution, and burial.

And as you experience those details again, marvel at how the most marginal characters seem to know what's going on in the story, while the experts are dumbfounded. Most notably are the unnamed woman who anoints Jesus for his burial (14:3-9) and the centurion at the foot of the cross (15:21-41). Meanwhile, the religious leads and political leaders all sign off on his death as though he were a common criminal. Peter denies knowing him. And Judas betrays him.

We know, of course, that death will not hold Jesus. Nevertheless, his suffering and death are not imaginary. They are real. And God's unbelievable love for us cannot be denied.

As we marvel at God's incredible love made known to us in Jesus, it is a good time for us to say thanks. And we engage in so many wonderful rituals of thanks in November. We gather for our Thank You Thanksgiving Dinner, hosted by the youth of Immanuel (November 10). We gather that same day to hear a word of greeting and thanks from People's Church, an Indigenous Ministry in Bemidji and recipient of a \$1000 Immanuel Endowment gift. We reflect on the gift of church and ponder our financial gifts for 2025 with help from 6 speakers who will share on Sundays and Wednesdays in November. We gather for the evening of Thanksgiving on November 27 before our nation's day of Thanksgiving the next day.

Grace and peace to you, dear people of God. I am thankful for all of you and the opportunity to share the good news of Jesus with you week after week - and invite you into continued investment in the work of the church. Grace and peace!
