From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Grace and peace to you in the name of the risen Christ. Just as we journeyed through 40 days of Lent, we rejoice for 50 days in the risen Lord, Jesus!!

This month, as we continue our year-long deep dive into Mark's gospel, we look at Jesus' continued ministry in Capernaum (Mark 2:1-3:35). This section is full of actions on Jesus' part that stir all kinds of controversy. Most of the controversies involve Jesus doing

something and the people around him saying, "Can he do that?!" or "He shouldn't be doing that!" Some of the highlights include:

- 1. Jesus not only healing a paralyzed man, but forgiving his sins (2:1–11). Can he do that?!
- 2. Jesus calling a tax a tax collector named Levi to be one of his followers (2:13–17). And by the end of the day, he's eating a meal at Levi's house with all kinds of tax collectors. This is the first meal Jesus shares with others in Mark's gospel. And he is eating with some of the most despised people in Jewish culture. Can he do that?!!
- 3. Jesus heals a man with a withered hand on the Sabbath (3:1–6). Jews were not supposed to do work on the Sabbath day. Can he do that?!!
- 4. Jesus not only heals people with unclean spirits, he appoints his 12 disciples and gives them authority to cast out unclean spirits, too (3:7–28). The religious authorities don't like this and say in so many words, "He can't do this!"
- 5. And when Jesus' own family members would like him to quit hanging around with such questionable people (3:31–35), Jesus says that those who do the will of God are his mother, sister and brother. Both men and women have a place in this emerging kingdom! Can he do that?!!

Yes he can. Jesus is the Lord of the universe. And it is his will to cross boundaries that others are not always willing to cross. Jesus is willing to go to places that others aren't always willing to go. And those who follow him across those boundaries are named as part of his family.

Keep reading Mark's gospel, my friends! As you see Jesus crossing boundaries, remember that he will go to the ends of earth to save you from sin and death, too. Follow him – and become part of his family.




Backpacks for Kids
