From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

As the seasons change from late summer to early autumn, grace and peace to you in the name of Jesus. Hard to believe the calendar is already flipping to September. May it be a time of getting back to many of the things we love around here at Immanuel, including Wednesday education, fellowship, and worship, and some of our favorite service projects, too.



I am also excited to keep digging into the Gospel of Mark. This month's set of readings are from Mark 8:27–10:52 and are all about Jesus preparing his disciples for his suffering and death. Let me focus on just a few key sections.

In 8:27–30, Jesus confirms his identity as the Messiah, but he orders them to tell no one about him. Why? Because they do not yet fully understand what being the Messiah means. He will NOT deliver them from their enemies with sword and earthly might – but with something else.

In 8:31–33, Jesus predicts his death for the first time in Mark. And already, the disciples cannot believe their ears. Peter insists that it will not be so. But Jesus rebukes him – even calls him Satan – and insists that to stand in his way to the cross is to oppose the very ways of God.

In 8:34–9:1, Jesus turns his focus to his disciples and prepares them for their own suffering as well. He tells them that following him means they will pick up their crosses, too. The same followers who went into the world with his authority to heal and cast out demons will also suffer with Jesus, too.

In chapter 9:2–13, Jesus and his inner core of disciples ascend a mountain and Jesus is transfigured before them. He turns dazzling white, Moses and Elijah appear before them, and a voice booms out from heaven declaring that this Jesus is God's Son. It's an obvious revelation of who Jesus is, and yet, it doesn't change his mission to die on the cross. Soon they descend the mountain and within a few more verses, Jesus predicts his death a second time (Mark 9:30–32).

Even as Jesus teaches them about humility and suffering, the disciples can't quite get past their idea that Jesus will soon be assuming earthly power. And so they ask him for their share of that power several times in this section of Mark. Nevertheless, Jesus keeps pointing them toward his own suffering and calling them to humility. In Mark 10:43–45, he tells them that greatness in God's kingdom isn't measured by earthly power. It is measured by humility and a willingness to serve. Challenging teachings. But truthful.

Keep reading Mark's gospel, my friends! And keep seeking greatness by following Christ's example of love and humility.

IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATES

The council met on Wednesday, August 14, 2024. President Mike Brunsberg called the meeting to order.

Endowment Committee: Pastor Nate reported that \$1350 of Endowment funds was used to purchase battery char2ers for hurricane relief kits. 110 battery char2ers were ordered and shipped down to New Orleans. A motion was made by Mar,:ie Anderson and seconded to approve the money used to buy battery chargers for the hurricane relief kits from the Endowment Fund.

Congregational Life: Peggy Larson—Met Tuesday, August 13, 2024. We served VBS meals and served on average 40 meals per night. A congregational fall kick off meal will be served on September 4 and door prizes will be given away. The Wednesday night meal menu is set and will be posted. We will be offering To Go meals for youth who are unable to attend the meal but are attending education time. A sign up sheet will be posted asking for desserts for Wednesday meals. In addition to our Wednesday meals, Meagan Ferris is putting together a game/art cart for youth and adults to use before and after they eat.

Outreach Evangelism: Rick Johnson— A committee will meet on September 8 to review the cards received with any questions. Another committee meeting will be held on September 10 to react to any questions received on the cards.

Parish Education: Vacant-Did not meet

Property Management: Steph Drange - Did not meet

Worship and Music: Anne Oldakowski- Next meeting will be August 26, 2024- The new accompanist, Matthew Greenwaldt is working out well; he plays the 3rd Sunday of the month. Committee is looking to order replacement books for "Now the Feast," and looking at options for a more stable Sanctuary screen. Also to be discussed: organ volume. Wednesday services start September 4, Rally Sunday is September 8th.

Youth Leadership: Katie Johnson-Did not meet

Immanuel Church Women: Diane Teigland- The ICW has been cutting blocks and serving for funerals throughout the summer. Diane will purchase coffee and please let her know when it is needed.

Lead Pastor: Pastor Nate Loer—June, July & early August highlights: 1.Summer worship has been going well. It would always be nice to see more people, but we understand that summer comes just once a year. 2. VBS was August 4–8 and was great. 30 kids and 20 adults took part. And the congregational life team served supper each night. I got to share opening and closing music every day which was fun. 3. We sent 3 youth and 2 adults to New Orleans for the ELCA Gathering July 15–21. Over 16,000 participants attended. Gathering will be in Minneapolis in the summer of 2027. 4. Elana reports we sent eight kids to Bible camp this summer. Next year, we 're going to offer 100%scholarships to every kid who wants to go to camp. 5. Recent funerals/Burials: Lorraine Kuyava (June 15); Nancy Nordquist (June 21), Adele Leeseberg (July 24), Char Schloeder (July 27), Arlene Krell (August 9), Robert Grendahl (August 10). It is always an honor to walk alongside families as they lay their loved ones to rest. 6. Weddings: Was part of Tyler Wheeler and Anne Domanus' wedding July 13 in Cambridge. Have two more couples I'm working with who will be married in September. 7. Vacation: Enjoyed time away from the office July 6–12 and July 29–August 4. Thank you to our hosts and to Jil for providing pulpit supply. Coming Up: 1. I plan to be out of the office Monday August 26–Sunday September 1. 2. We are ramping up for fall– and there is a lot to do.

Financial Secretary Report: Given by Jane Bagstad – The total of Sunday general offerings counted and deposited in July was \$16,299. This does not include direct deposits.

Finance Committee: Bryan Greenwaldt – "Email" meeting August 2, 2024 – I sent out the "Budget v.s. Actual" numbers for the first half of 2024 for the committee to review. All line items are right on track with the budget. We will be scheduling a meeting in September to start discussing Stewardship.

Other Business – The council discussed the Jeremiah 29 community project. There is a Community Project Committee with an expense of \$450 a year. The council was supportive of this project and a motion was made by Peggy Larson and seconded by Sue Johnson to fund up to \$450 a year for up to three years to be shared with the community project committee. Motion passed. The council discussed the continuing project of obtaining more Immanuel family pictures for the church directory. It was decided that on September 15 and 22 a schedule of 5–10 minute slots would be available one and one half hours before and one and one half hours after church services for those families who wish to have their pictures in the directory. These dates will be for a professional photographer. October 1st will be the last date to text pictures to Pastor Nate. More candid pictures will be taken on August 18th and the 25th at Immanuel for those families who wish to participate in this manner.

The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Motion made by Mike Brunsberg to adjourn. Peggy Larson seconded. Motion carried.
