

#### From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Grace and peace to you, dear friends in Christ. As usual, the summer weeks and months are slipping by quickly. I hope you find some time in the month ahead for travel, rest, refreshment, and whatever else rejuvenates you!





In Acts 1:1–2, Luke begins this book the same way he began his Gospel – by addressing someone named Theophilus. He also mentions that his Gospel was about the work Jesus BEGAN to do, suggesting that there is more work to do. That's what's happening here in this second book. And though we call this book, "The Acts of the Apostles," perhaps we should really call it, "The Acts of the Risen Jesus and the Holy Spirit."

In Acts 1:3–14, Luke picks up the story he told at the end of his Gospel – Jesus' ascension. Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit, and promises his followers that they will receive power to give witness to his life, death, and resurrection in an ever broadening circle: in Jerusalem, all Judea, Samaria, and to the end of the earth. This sets the course for the book. After Jesus ascends, they worship ... and wait.

After a brief story in Acts 1:15–26 of finding a replacement for Judas, the story shifts dramatically. In Acts 2:1–13, during the Jewish festival of Pentecost, as Jews from all over the world are visiting Jerusalem, the Holy Spirit shows up. These apostles begin to speak languages they've never studied, so that all who are gathered hear about Jesus in their own language. It is an amazing moment — even though some make an accusation of drunkenness to explain it all.

In Acts 2:14–41, we hear our first lengthy speech in the book of Acts. Almost 1/3 of this book is speeches, so brace yourself for that! Peter explains that all of this is a fulfillment of scripture and begins telling them about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. And by the end of the day, 3,000 people are added to this new and emerging church.

And in Acts 2:42–47, an uncommon community is already emerging, one rooted in radical equality. These followers sell all that they have and distribute the proceeds according to need. "And day by day," says Luke in 2:47, "the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

What will happen next in this incredible, developing community of faith? Stay tuned! Humbly in Christ,
