From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Final third of summer greetings to you in the name of Jesus, our Brother.

On the 11th Sunday after Pentecost – August 21 this year – we will read part of Psalm 103 in worship. Let me just share the first two verses: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless God's holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all God's benefits."

The Psalmist then shares in rich poetry a mighty list of God's blessings, showered upon us: forgiveness, healing, redemption from death and the grave, mercy, good

things, renewal, vindication in the face of injustice, and finally crescendo-ing to that beloved line about God who is "slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love" (vs. 8)

If you were to make a list of God's benefits, what would make your list? What is it about God's faithfulness and provision that you would never want to forget? And does that list motivate you to gather with God's people to sing God's praises, to remember Christ Jesus through Word and Sacrament?

I hope summer has been a refreshing season for you. I further hope that as fall approaches, we might begin anew as a congregation to be rooted in God's Word, God's love, God's faithfulness. I hope that collectively, as a congregation, we make sure we don't forget about God's presence in our lives. What might that mean for you and your family? What practices might you commit again to continuing? To reviving? To picking up for the first time?

Of course, our relationship with God is rooted in His mercy and grace. God is always more ready to forgive than we are to ask. But it does take commitment on our part to be part of this movement we call the church.

And we are only as able to remember as our practices allow.

What a joy to be God's people. And being God's people means certain responsibilities, too. Let us commit again to being God's people. But enjoy a few more summer days while they last, too!

The council met on June 8, 2022. President Robby Grendahl called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm. Devotions were given by Jennifer Brunsberg. Minutes from the May meeting were accepted. May meeting noted did hear several concerns from Ed Bruns.

Congregational Life: Stephanie Drange—Did not meet. Family Picnic 6.1.22. Served 60-65 people.

Outreach Evangelism: Sara Stone – Met 6.7.22. Discussed the upcoming visit from the Svennungsen's on July 3rd. o Made plans to recruit some members for the YAGM mission sub-committee. We are looking for a youth member if the congregation and at least one other congregation member to be a part of this. Discussed some educational opportunities to raise awareness regarding outreach effort such as YAGM and Lutheran Refugee Services. Will continue to explore the best options for outreach and raising awareness.

Parish Education: vacant—Did not meet.

This will be revisited this in the fall. • Fall Schedule Thoughts/ Options for services were: ELW settings; One Body Alive; Now The Feast; and Praise Service, which will fit more on Wednesday's. • Budget and Supplies: A report has been requested for details on what has been spent thus far this year.
