From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Happy New Year! It feels like I just got used to writing "2025" on all my documents. And now, it's time to say farewell to that year and embrace 2026.

And as I have done the last several years, I'm going to challenge you to put your nose in your Bibles this year as well. In 2023, I challenged you to read the book of Matthew. In 2024, the book of Mark. Last year, I challenged you to read both Luke and Acts.

In 2026, let's complete the "Gospel Challenge" and get into the book of John. And not just John's gospel. Read the Epistles of John, too (AKA 1, 2, and 3 John). You can read at whatever pace you'd like. But I'll be commenting on these readings throughout the year to help you as best I can in that journey.

As you prepare to read John's gospel, I want you to prepare yourself: this gospel isn't like the other gospels. Of course, it is like the others in that John tells the story of his ministry, his arrival in Jerusalem, his arrest, trial, crucifixion, and resurrection. But there is a LOT of material in John that you do not find anywhere else. Let's assume that John isn't trying to "fill in the blanks" for us with what's "missing" from Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Let's just assume that John is working from a different set of stories than those other gospel writers and is telling the story of Jesus in his own way.

Having said that, I encourage you to take a small bite of John's gospel this month. Simply read John 1:1–18. And might I suggest that you read it more than once – perhaps even every day this month. And as you read it, think of it as an overture in a musical. An overture introduces bits and pieces of musical phrases and themes that you will hear in greater detail and fullness in the rest of the musical. John 1:1–18 functions in a similar way in the gospel of John. Using poetic images, John 1:1–18, introduces themes like light vs. darkness, earthly life vs. eternal life, the testimony of John the Baptist, the rejection of Jesus by the world, the glory of this incarnate One, Jesus' relationship to the law, Jesus' relationship to God the Father. These are all themes we can expect as the gospel of John unfolds.

These verses also get you thinking about some very deep ideas. "In the beginning" should take you all the way back to the creation story of Genesis I, with themes like the Word, light, darkness, etc. But then moves in a new direction when we hear in John 1:14 that this word, "became flesh and lived among us." What is this new thing that is happening in this old, old story? We will have to wait and see!

I'm looking forward to this coming year – and I hope you will find lots of ways to grow spiritually in the year ahead – Through John and through the other opportunities to learn, worship, share fellowship, and live generously here at Immanuel!

Committee Reports:

Endowment Committee: Received of ND farmland, and was sold for \$130,000 which is a WONDERFUL gift to the fund.

Congregational Life: Diane Breitling—We continue to keep busy with Wednesday evening suppers. In addition, we hosted a Christmas cookie potluck following the Choir's Christmas Concert on Dec 14th. We are holding a food drive for the Wadena Food Shelf throughout the month of December. Special thanks to Elana for creating postcards to send to the congregation with a list of most needed items for the food shelf, and to Steph and Peggy for heading up the Giving Tree Project. Outreach Evangelism: Vacant—Did not meet.

Parish Education: Meagan Ferris—The Worship Wednesday Children's Christmas Program was a joyful and successful evening celebrating the true meaning of Christmas. 
