From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Late-summer greetings to you in the name of our generous and faithful God, ruler of heaven and earth! I hope you can savor these beautiful days of growth and warmth as we transition from summer toward fall. And as you savor this final month of summer, I hope you can continue to engage with the gospel of Mark (or take up reading for the first time it isn't too late!!). This month's installment of Mark focuses on Mark 6:6b-8:26 as Jesus continues to preach throughout Galilee. Here are a few insights on those teachings to guide your reading.

In Mark 6:6b-13, Jesus reacts to his hometown rejection by sending his disciples to other places. He sends them with his power and authority, but he also sends them prepared to be rejected. This is an important theme in the chapters ahead. Some will believe. Others will reject.

Then the story flashes back to a gruesome story about the death of John the Baptist. And why would Mark tell such a story? Because it foreshadows Jesus' rejection and death, too. And the suffering and rejection that us as his followers will face, too.

Meanwhile, back to the main story, we see a series of miracles from Jesus in chapters 6-8. And yet, even as Jesus feeds and heals, people continually fail to understand who he is. The Pharisees see him as a threat to their power. The disciples don't fully understand the purpose of his ministry. Even those who receive his miracles don't understand the deeper meaning of his abilities - they simply want more food and more healing. But Jesus has come to do more than just multiply food and cast our demons. He has come to suffer and die and conquer death by rising again.

Finally, it will take both seeing AND understanding to get this. And the moment that captures this reality in this section of Mark comes in 8:22-26. Jesus opened the eyes of a blind man, and at first he can only see what seems to be trees walking around. So, Jesus touches him a second time and he can both see and understand.

So it is with us. We know that he is the Lord of all things, including our physical needs. But we need more than that. We need someone to forgive our sin, promise us life beyond this earthly life, someone to journey with us through all things. This is who lesus is most of all – and he is more clearly revealed not in multiplying food and healing disease. He is more clearly revealed in the cross.

Keep reading Mark's gospel, my friends! May we see in this Jesus one who tends to all our needs, including the need for forgiveness and eternal life.






