WORKING WITH A FUNERAL/MEMORIAL HOME

Professionals can be very helpful in advising you on the many practical aspects of making arrangements for your loved one. They can assist you in burial or cremation arrangements, scheduling the service, writing the obituary for the newspaper, flowers etc. Their fees will often include payments that they make on your behalf to people involved in the service. Please confirm such arrangements with them. A service may be held at a Mortuary, but we encourage you to have the service for your loved one at Immanuel.

SCHEDULING AND PLANNING THE SERVICE

Funerals or memorial services are times of passage in which we gather to grieve, share stories, celebrate life and give thanks to God for the promises of eternal life. The members and staff of Immanuel Lutheran Church seek to be of comfort and assist you in any way possible.

Please confer with the pastor before you schedule the day and the time of the service. Timing will depend upon whether the service is to be a funeral or a memorial service. The difference between a funeral and a memorial service is the presence or absence of the casket. Because the casket is present at a funeral, such a service needs to be held within a few days of the death. Because there is no casket at a memorial service, it can occur several days or weeks later.

The pastor will meet with you to plan the service and provide bereavement counseling. If there are hymns, Scripture passages and a special reading you would like included in the service, let the pastor know. The pastor will also have suggestions for music and Scripture readings. A family member or friend of the deceased may read Scripture or do a vocal or instrumental solo.

In addition, family members or friends may share some remembrances of the loved one at the service, at the reviewal or during refreshments following the service.

The church provides a bulletin for the order of service. There is also a Funeral Pall available for use. (A pall is a large cloth that covers the coffin before it is brought into church. It ties our baptism to our death and resurrection in Christ.)

AN ORDER OF CLOSURE AT THE TIME OF DEATH

(A pastor, chaplain, family member or friend may use this order in the home or resident's room at the time of death.)

In the name of the Father, + the Son and the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Scripture: (A favorite Scripture passage may be read or Psalm 23.)

Psalm 23: The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want; He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters; He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil, my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Sharing

(Those gathered are invited to share a remembrance of the loved one.)

Prayer: Eternal God, we thank you for the life we shared with _____. Deal graciously with us who mourn our loss. May we be comforted by the promises of your Word that remind us that nothing can separate us from your love, not even death. Help us now to release our loved one to your keeping trusting that we will be reunited in your eternal kingdom. This we pray in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. Amen.

Lord's Prayer: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever Amen.

Blessing: Make the sign of the cross on the brow of the deceased as you say, *you have been marked with the cross of Christ forever. Amen.*

MEMORIAL GIFTS

You may specify the organizations that you wish to benefit from gifts given in memory of your loved one. Gifts given to Immanuel may be designated and will be acknowledged by a Memorial Committee member and recorded. It is good to include the family wishes regarding memorials in the obituary written for the newspaper and the bulletin for the service.

RECEPTIONS

One of the Women's serving groups will serve the lunch following the service. The menu for a noon meal would include hot or cold dish, a salad, bread or buns, pickles, cupcakes and beverages. A lunch in the afternoon or morning would include filled buns or open faced sandwiches, potato chips, pickles, cupcakes and a beverage. There is no charge for members except a donation to cover the cost or the groceries. For non-members, a minimum of \$100 plus the cost of the groceries is the suggested donation to Immanuel Church Women. If a family chooses, they may cater the meal or a portion of it at their expense and served by one of the serving groups.

OTHER FEES

Fees are often arranged through the funeral home. If the services of a funeral home are not used, for members there is no charge for use of the church or the service of the pastor. For non-members, a gift to the church and pastor would be appreciated. For members and non-members, an honorarium of \$75 to \$125 is suggested for the organist and soloist and a gift of \$35-\$50 is suggested for the custodian since the custodian is not fulltime staff member.

MUSICAL RESOURCES

If there are favorite songs that you would like included in the service, let the pastor know. Usually within the service, there are three or four musical numbers that can be sung by the congregation or as solos. On the next page are some suggestions for songs that are in the ELW Worship Book. If there is a song you want that is not in the ELW, we can print the words in the bulletin.
