From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Continued Easter greetings to you in the name of our risen Lord, Jesus Christ. This month our 50-day celebration of Easter will culminate with Pentecost on Sunday, May 19 and give way to our long season of green paraments as we once again mark our time in "Sundays after Pentecost."



And we also continue our steady journey through Mark's gospel in these monthly newsletter installments. This month, we turn our focus to Mark 4:1–34 and hear Jesus

teach his followers using parables. Let me share a bit about these parables to aid you in your reading and study:

In Mark 4:1–9, Jesus begins this chapter with a doozy of a parable. He tells about a sower who scattered see all over the place. Is this a story of a reckless farmer? Or does the story reflect on the reality of farming in the middle–east? Not exactly the richest of soils! And yet, despite the challenges, notice in the parable that an abundant harvest comes nonetheless. So it is with God's love and mercy: it yields fruit in surprising places.

In 4:13–20, Jesus explains the parable of the sower to his followers. And I think his words resonate with us. We know that struggles, distractions, and the evil one all conspire to snuff out faith before it even has a chance to begin. And even though that's frustrating, we carry forward in sharing the gospel with the whole world.

In 4:21–25, Jesus shifts to a new parable about how lamps belong on lampstands. This is our task as the church, as people of faith. Keep proclaiming! And then he says this curious line: "The measure you give will be the measure you get, and still more will be given to you" (v. 24). The true value of the gospel can only be found by giving it away!

Finally, in 4:26–34, Jesus tells two parables about the mystery of growing seeds. Again we see the certainty of an abundant harvest from next-to invisible beginnings. It is also interesting how these parables toggle between a call to action and a work of promise that there will be fruit even without human involvement.

Keep reading Mark's gospel, my friends! And feel the urgency for faith to be more than a private matter in your life. Feel the urgency to share that good news with your neighbors near and far. Because the more you share Jesus, the more you receive Him.
