From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

How is that New Year's resolution to read the gospel of Mark coming? If you've been part of my Early Risers Class, you've gotten through the first 4 chapters at least. But if you haven't started, don't worry! There is still plenty of time. You can actually sit down and read the entire book in about an hour. Last month, I gave you a couple tips, thanks to Donald Juel's book, "A Master of Surprise." Specifically, I encouraged you to pay attention to 1) How Jesus crosses boundaries and 2) The Parables he tells. This month, I have two more tips for you thanks to Juel's insights.

- 3. Pay attention to Jesus' authority over demons ... and why that's important. Mark's gospel, says Juel, arranges the stories of demons in order to express two themes. The first theme is "the restoration of an outsider to life within the community" (page 66). While the demon-possessed often were pushed to the fringes of society, Jesus' casting out of such demons is another example of His desire to restore outcasts to the greater population. The other theme of these actions is that in casting out demons, Jesus makes it clear that he has authority over all the forces of evil in this world. Juel uses the language of "binding the strong man," referring to Jesus' ability to subdue Satan. In casting out demons, Jesus is declaring "his role as lord of the house. . . . [H]e initiates that reign by securing control of the house, establishing a sphere of God's rule" (page 72) In short, Mark's emphasis on the demonic declares that Jesus has come to usurp Satan's power on earth. But we are wise to remember that Jesus doesn't exercise this authority merely to conquer a foe. Again and again, Jesus will conquer evil and work to restore those alienated by evil back into community life. Even when the community finds this terrifying.
- 4. Pay attention to Jesus' talk about suffering and how it reveals Jesus' true identity. Mark

Again and again, Mark wants it to be clear that Jesus' true identity can only be seen in His death. Titles like "Christ" and "Son of God" are written by Mark in the beginning of the gospel, and they appear in the middle, but are spoken by demons or incorrectly conceived (as in Peter's confession of Jesus as the Christ). But only after He has died can it be said that Jesus is the Son of God. In fact, this death makes it so clear that even a Roman soldier see it. Mark's Christology is important for us to observe, because we often want to look at the signs of Jesus' divinity as his works of miraculous proportions. However, Mark wants us to see that the only true sign of Jesus' identity is in the passion. While Mark tells us a lot about Jesus in his stories of healing, Jesus' true identity is only revealed in Mark's passion narrative. And so it is for those who follow Him. Not just the suffering. But the true character of Christian community will be revealed in service, love, and suffering for the sake of faith and the neighbor.

Continued blessings to you in 2024. Once again, stay rooted in God's Word!!
