### From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Happy New Year! As we say farewell to 2024 and greet the dawning of 2025, I pray God's blessing on you and your family – blessings that ripple God's love and provision out to your neighbors near and far.



Last year, I challenged you to read the gospel of Mark. This year, I'm going to double my challenge and encourage you to read both Luke AND Acts. That may

sound like a huge undertaking, but you have 12 months to do it!! And I'll provide some commentary to guide us along the way each month, too.

In January, get off to a good start in this journey by reading Luke 1:1–2:52. Here are a few things to pay attention to in these verses.

First, notice how Luke uses the names and dates of powerful people to let us know how to place this moment in history. And also notice, that when God acts, he doesn't act among those powerful people, but to unknown, powerless people. The word comes to Zechariah ... and to a woman in Nazareth named Mary! The uplifting of the powerless and the humbling of the powerful is another thing to notice in these chapters as well. We will certainly see that theme continue in the rest of the book, too.

Second, notice how Luke is very careful to tell stories that identify the faithfulness of Jesus' family to Jewish customs and rituals. And at the same time, this Jesus will bring good news to all nations and peoples.

Third, notice how the infancy stories of both John and Jesus already make it clear that these boys are special. John is to drink no wine – and the angels predicts that he will be full of the Holy Spirit and the power of Elijah. Jesus' birth is heralded by angels and when presented in the temple at 8-days old, Simeon and Anna give prophesies about him. And at age 12, he is already visiting in the temple with the elders and impressing them with his questions and knowledge.

Finally, pause and appreciate that so much of these early chapters of Luke is unique to Luke. The annunciation of John the Baptist's birth as told by the angel to his father, Zechariah. The trip to Bethlehem and the birth of Jesus in a stable. The story of Jesus presented in the temple at 8-days old. The story of the boy Jesus lost in Jerusalem. Even the shepherds being told of the birth by the host of angels in their fields is only told in Luke's gospel.

Savor these stories, my friends. And next month, we'll explore another section of Luke. Until then, blessings on your early days of 2025. Stay rooted in God's Word!!

#### IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATES

The council met on Sunday, December 15, 2024. President Mike Brunsberg called the meeting to order.

**Endowment Committee:** Pastor Nate reported that additional gifts were made to ICW Quilting (\$1,000), Empty Stocking (\$2,000), and People's Church (\$1,000). A motion was made by Bryan Greenwaldt and seconded by Rick Johnson to ratify these payments. A total of \$15,000 has been made from these funds this year.

Congregational Life: Peggy Larson—The Christmas potluck and craft event held on December 15 were a success. It was an awesome year!

Outreach Evangelism: Rick Johnson—Did not meet. Backpacks are being filled and the Giving Tree program is going well. Gift wrapping will be held as planned.

Parish Education: Vacant—Did not meet

Property Management: Steph Drange- Absent. Steph has continued to work with contractors to complete projects.

Worship and Music: Anne Oldakowski- Met on Dec. 8th. The committee looked at various mock-ups for TV displays in the sanctuary to replace the projector/screen combo that is currently being used. Considerations were sizing, locations, mounting, wiring, and any possible obstacles.

Youth Leadership: Katie Johnson-Absent Met on Dec. 4th: The Christmas Event to occur on Dec. 15th will be hosted by the Congregation Life Committee. Youth leaders will attend Wednesday night evening meals to play games with the younger kids. The Christmas program will be directed by Amsale, Isabelle, Anna, and Chloe. In the future plans are being discussed for a youth lock-up (ages and length oflock-up), Nerf war for kindergarten and up, and possibly a preschool, kindergarten and parent craft and movie day. We also hope to contact the Hegarty's to have an ice skating event at their home.

**Immanuel Church Women:** Diane Teigland, Absent The women's groups have served lunch for several funerals. 54 quilts and over 300 health Care kits were shipped.


#### Our Vision and Mission-Other Business
