#### From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Lenten greetings to you all in the name of the one we strive to follow: our Lord, Jesus Christ. I've spent the last few months giving you some overall thoughts on reading the Gospel of Mark. This month, we dig more deeply into Mark chapter 1. If you've been engaged in worship, you know that we've been spending LOTS of time in Mark chapter 1, so I'll try not to repeat myself too much!



Mark begins his gospel by making two really important claims about Jesus: "The beginning of the good news of Jesus *Christ*, the *Son of God*" (Mark 1:1, emphasis added). We hear these labels for Jesus all the time, so we might not notice their significance. But consider how important they are. This Jesus Mark is about to tell us about is God's anointed (that's what "Christ" means) and is, in fact, the very Son of God.


Mark will then spend his gospel doing two things (at least!): 1) Telling us what it means to be Messiah and Son of God; and 2) Showing us how the others in the story see Jesus' identity revealed and how they react.

What does it mean to be the Son of God and the anointed one? Well, it doesn't mean he will be spared temptation. In Mark 1:9–15, Jesus is driven into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan for 40 days. It also doesn't mean that he will perform his ministry among great and powerful people. In Mark 1:16–20 he calls four fishermen based out of Galilee to be his first disciples. Galilee was far from the center of power in that culture. And fishermen were certainly capable people – but not the most powerful people in that culture either.

Being Messiah/Christ does mean that Jesus has power over demons, illness, and disease. But notice something more. As Jesus heals those marginalized by their sickness, his fame spreads and the crowds grow. And he doesn't use this fame to become powerful. He uses it to serve others. At the end of Mark 1, Jesus heals a leper whose illness had kept him away from others. The man was able to re-join society. But this act of healing has cost Jesus something. Now, he is unable to go into the city. He has effectively "traded places" with the leperous man. It is a foreshadowing of the way he will trade places with us on the cross, taking our sin and giving us his righteousness.

Keep reading Mark's gospel, my friends! And may God strengthen us, as always, to move forward boldly in faith. And follow this one who gives us His whole self in love.

#### IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL UPDATES

The council met on Sunday, February 11, 2024. President Mike Brunsberg called the meeting to order.

Congregational Life: Peggy Larson- Met on February 11, 2024 - Discussed the Bingo/Baked Potato event on February 25. Volunteers to make bars and serve soup for Wednesday Lenten meals. Meals were planned for the remaining Wednesday Lenten meals in April. The council members will be providing the meal on March 13th and working the supper. New member Sunday will be on March 10th, 2024. We will provide coffee and snack after the 9:30 service. Planning began for next year.

Outreach Evangelism: Rick Johnson-Did not meet - Rick reported that Pastor Nate had been meeting with new members. Council discussed how to improve the reception/greeting of new members and the use of name tags for identification of council. Margie Anderson to see about getting the name tags with assistance from Katie Johnson.

Parish Education: Vacant-Did not meet - Wednesday discipleship is going well. There has been good attendance for classes. May 1st will be the last day. Elana to get a group together to discuss topics.

Pastor Nate brought up the need for a reliable, prompt source of hot water in the kitchen sink. Council discussed materials needed, cost, and process to achieve this result. Estimated total cost of the project is \$1500. A property budget line item can be used to fund the project according to Pastor Nate. A motion was made by Sue Johnson and Seconded by Jane Bagstad to proceed with the project using a local contractor. Motion carried.

Worship and Music: Anne Oldakowski-Met on February 5, 2024 - Still have special music sign ups available. Hymn selection is up to date. Discussed all upcoming services including Lent and Easter.

Youth Leadership: Katie Johnson-Met on February 7, 2024 - The ice skating event for February 18th was canceled. Youth Lent take over will be Wednesday February 21st, Baked Potato Bar and Bingo will be on February 25th, Sunday March 3rd the youth will lead worship, Palm Sunday the youth will serve breakfast, Easter Egg filling will be Wednesday, March 27th with the Easter Egg Hunt March 31st following services.
