From the Desk of Pastor Nate...

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Hallelujah!! Grace and peace to you, Easter people of God!! Easter is more than one Sunday. It is a 50-day season of celebrating the resurrection of our Lord. And on the 40th day of that season, we celebrate Jesus' ascension. This celebration is May 18 this year.

Luke 24:44-53 tells the story this way:

Then [Jesus] said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that

the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

Jesus completes his earthly mission in this story. He has died and been raised. And now he ascends to the Father so that the Holy Spirit might come and strengthen us to bring this news to the world. Did you notice the words of Jesus here? He says we are witnesses of his suffering, death, and resurrection. Jesus doesn't say, "I hope you will be my witnesses." He tells us we ARE witnesses.

It was such a joy to host Pastor Pimpinan Sijabat, his wife, Roma, and their twin boys on April 23. He spoke about the importance of understanding ourselves as witnesses. The question isn't whether or not we give witness to Christ. The question is how.

My invitation to you is to make this your daily prayer this Easter season. Whenever you are in a group of people – at the store, in a restaurant, in a meeting, a conversation with others – pray this way: "Lord, Jesus, I know you have called me to witness to the new life found in you. Show me how I might share your love today. Amen."

The council met on April 16, 2023. President Jennifer Brunsberg called the meeting to order.

Congregational Life: Peggy Larson– Met on April 16, 2023

The last few Lenten meals were well attended. \$922.50 was given during the Lenten free will offering. This will be divided between Wadena Food Shelf and Lutheran World Relief. Monetary donations are appreciated greatly. Remaining three Wednesday night meals were planned and we will have pizza and ice cream floats on the last Wednesday meal. Plan to hold a Welcome Back Picnic on Thursday, Aug 31, 2023 at Tapley Park. It is the consensus of the committee that we should continue to provide Wednesday night meals next year and add a few congregational events throughout the year. There will be a focus on having other congregational members help serve the meals. It was agreed that committee members would help serve the VBS meals this summer.
